

The Scory Behind the Cover Image

This front cover illustration comes from the House books of Mendelian and Landauer Twelve Brother house foundations, the Nuremberg Municipal Library. These books represent over 1300 manufacturing process and handicrafts from the 15th to the 19th century. This image appears in 1561. In this plate the chef stands before his hearth with a wooden spoon and tasted food from a pot, standing with two other of the blazing hearth. About the flames hangs a kettle. On the shelf are upturned pots, pans three stuck in the holder. The adjoining room, which is probably is the dining room, is empty except for a table and bench, where you can see a window with green pebbles.

Trial by Fire/Lochmere Arrow September 8-10, 2017 • Barony of Bright Hills

Trial by Fire/Lochmere Arrow is returning to Bright Hills September 8-10. Archers will vie for the coveted Lochmere Arrow. The bards will keep all entertained. Plus, this year is the 20th anniversary of the Trial By Fire cooking competition, so the cooks have some special competitions planned. Camping is available and there will be a potluck Saturday night. It's time to put it on your calendar, so you don't miss out.

MARTIAL ACTIVITIES: Archers will compete for the right to bring the Lochmere Arrow home to their barony, shire or canton. The actual shoot is always creative, fiercely contested and a lot of fun!

LOCHMERE ARROW COMPETITION: Good gentles, Bright Hills will be hosting the Lochmere Arrow this year. Anyone can participate in this shoot. To compete for the Lochmere Arrow you will need to have teams of two from any Barony, Shire or Canton. Teams of two will shoot together and at the end of the day the highest score will be the winner of the Lochmere Arrow. If you win this competition you or your group agrees to host next year's Lochmere Arrow.

TRIAL BY FIRE COMPETITION: This is the 20th anniversary of the Trial by Fire competition, so all previous Grand Champions are asked to mentor entrants in this competition! We hope to have lots of cooks and lots of mentors!

The basic Trial by Fire competition requires period recipes to be prepared onsite over using open flames and limited to cooking technologies used at the Pennsic War. No electricity allowed! However, you can use fire bowls, camp stoves, caterer's burners and hand tools. Documentation is required. Minimum documentation would include the original recipe, its source and your redaction. If the recipe uses period ingredients and methods, but not a period recipe, document all ingredients and methods to one culture, time and place. If there is an issue as to whether specific ingredients are period, Food by Waverly Root may be used to make that determination. More information to be found on the website.

BARDIC COMPETITION: Bright Hills Bardic Champion, Lord Faolan Mac Raghnaill, will hold a bardic competition. Mistress Fevronia is hosting a bardic competition at Trial by Fire. You need to perform two pieces, one period and one on either archery or fire. So get your hot stuff together and come on out to Trial by Fire for some fun and maybe go home with a prize!

POETRY COMPETITION: Lady Deirdre O'Bardon is offering a prize for the best poem in any period style about fire, food, archery or bards. Don't let the period requirement scare you. Most rhyming poetry is in a period style. This includes couplets, four line stanzas, three line stanzas and lots more! You get extra points for documentation.

OTHER: Lady Livia di Samuele is bringing her famous Sekunjabin Tavern to Trial by Fire/Lochmere Arrow.

SITE RESTRICTIONS: No alcohol on the archery field. No ground fires outside of firepits.

FEAST: Feast will be a potluck dinner. Just bring a dish large enough to feed at least 8.

LUNCH: There will be a fundraiser lunch sponsored by the Equestrians.

Trial by Lire: The Beginning

any years ago, when the world and we were young, many thoughts came to members of the Bright Hills Cooks Guild.

"We have triumphed over mundane meals. We have brought forth period dishes for the good Gentles of Barony and Kingdom using recipes from ancient texts. Our redaction and cooking skills have improved with every feast and there is no kitchen in all of Atlantia that has stumped us yet...what now?"

As they thought and thought, Pennsic War came and went; feasts were made and eaten and even more period dishes were translated into modern recipes and still nothing new presented itself to the cooks of the Guild. That is until one small voice asked...

"Why don't we try to cook as the ancestors did? Why not try to find a campfire, hearth or Weber grill and make these period meals that way?"

And thus was born, "Trial by Fire". Okay maybe that wasn't the exact way everything happened, but hopefully you get the idea.

The Guild, in order to provide an outlet for its need to cook and share the experience with others came up with this wiz-bang idea. Find a period recipe and prepare it over an open fire without electrical devices, as is the situation at Pennsic.

"Let's have four categories, grains, meats, vegetables and desserts," they said, "and award prizes in each category as well as an over-all winner. We'll invite all of Atlantia's cooks to compete and then we'll serve these dishes to those who came to watch."

And over the years the Bright Hills Cooks Guild did just that.

This year marks the 20th Anniversary of the Trial by Fire competition and something new has been added. This year, past Grand Champions are offering their skills as mentors to anyone who wants one. We would like all our baronial members to participate and enjoy the thrill of preparing medieval recipes, over an open fire. We invite you to research the recipe, write a simple documentation if you so desire, and attend the upcoming Trial by Fire, Saturday, 8-10 September at the Baltimore Bowman, 10301 Harford Road, Glen Arm, MD 21057. Keeping the Fire Burning \cdot A Short Distory of Trial by Fire

all began on January 25, 1997 (Anno Societatis XXXI) at the first Bright Hills Baronial Cooks' Guild. There were three individuals in attendance – Lady Margherita Tessatrice (the Baronial Minister of Arts and Sciences), Lady Cordelia FitzRobert of York, and Mistress Jeanne Tenneur de Bec (then Seneschal of the Barony). The meeting was held in our home (Mistress Jeanne and Master Chirhart Blackstar), and during the meeting it was decided that Lady Cordelia would be the head of the guild, since the others were holding baronial offices.

This was one of the best decisions ever made, because Cordelia knows more about medieval cooking than almost anyone (certainly more than anyone else in the Barony), and she taught us all a great deal over the next few years.

One of Cordelia's best ideas was the challenge of Trial by Fire. Because the Cooks' Guild typically works as a team, preparing feasts and our infamous "light lunches" and bake sales, this challenge would allow the individual cooks to demonstrate their own skills.

The Challenge - To create a period dish under the conditions found at PENNSIC.

For those who wonder what this means, cooking is to be done under 'primitive' or outdoor conditions. Open fire/ fire pits, Barbeque, propane burner or gas grill, charcoal or wood fired grills, Hibachi's, etc. No gas, electric, or battery operated appliances.

There are four categories of competition (see below), and one may choose to compete in just one or up to four of them.

- 1. Best Meat (includes fish and shellfish)
- 2. Best Vegetable
- 3. Best Grain (includes breads)
- 4. Best Dessert
- 5. Grand Champion (to be awarded at the judges' discretion)

Judging is based on the following criteria:

- 1. The presence of documentation.
- 2. Taste
- 3. Texture
- 4. Presentation
- 5. Bonus points based on the judge's experience in the field of period cooking, for example: if a dish has been religiously copied from a period source despite complexity or cost, or if a dish displays notable creativity within a recipe, etc.

The first Trial by Fire was held on July 6, 1997 in our backyard. It was a great success and was followed the next year by the "Son of Trial by Fire" under the guidance of the new guildmaster, Lord Hans van Horne was also held in our backyard and attracted quite a crowd. It was on this occasion the quote, "I didn't know that cooking was a spectator sport," came into being.

Trial by Fire three and four were also at our home.

Trial by Fire five was held in conjunction with an event autocratted by Baroness Ekaterina (now Chagan Baghsi), called One Last Chance, which was held on a farm in Jarretsville.

Trial by Fire six came back to our backyard.

Trial by Fire seven was hosted by Mistress Chryse and Lord Simon.

Trial by Fire eight was hosted by Lord Roberto du Nord and Lady Juliana.

Trial by Fire nine was held on a rainy day at the Baronial Farm and hosted by Baron Temur and Baroness Chagan.

Trial by Fire ten thru fourteen were all held at our home.

Trial by Fire fifteen was held in 2011. I wasn't able to locate information about it.

Trial by Fire sixteen was held on September 8, 2012, It was at this time that it was held as part of the Archers, Bards and Cooks event, partnering with the archers and the Lochmere Arrow competition.

Trial by Fire seventeen I have no information about.

Since 2014, Trial by Fire (18, 19 and now 20) has been held as part of a larger event, again with the archers. Since Bright Hills has won the Lochmere Arrow so often, this has been a wonderful partnership.

All together ten of the twenty Trial by Fires' were held in our backyard. It grew from a simple event that according to my husband wasn't an official event. He said, " it was just something to get people together without the constraints of real judging. An event just for fun, a good lazy day filled with friends and lots of food. Trial by Fire was created as a good place to practice for Pennsic and for each person to be able to cook on their own within medieval guidelines, to show off their skills."

Chirhart continued, "As this non-event grew people from other baronies asked to join in the fun and then it became a competition. For me though," he said, "It is a great memory of good food, fun, and friendship."

Sometimes the most simple of ideas grows legs and takes on a life of it's own, but remembering the history of it all keeps us grounded. So let's light the fire and get cooking!



SCA Equescrian Activities for the New or Non-Equescrian by Baroness Couyth Da Sillend

ow to get involved with Equestrian Activities whether you're a horse-owner, horseless rider, or helpful supporter - these could be 3 separate classes unto themselves, but for now, we'll discuss how to become generally involved with SCA Equestrian Activities.

Derhaps the hardest (but the most important) part of all - INTRODUCE yourself!

Perhaps the most intimidating part of joining any new activity is getting your foot in the door and becoming familiar with others in the same field. It's even harder when those involved in the activity seem to be so very busy and hard-pressed for time during the day (what with taking care of the horses, keeping the tourney field set up for each run, etc.) But it IS worth it to get to know those involved.

If people seem too busy, or if you're not quite up to engaging in a conversation while the activity is in full swing, then take a seat in the gallery to watch the challenges and make a mental note to go up and introduce yourself later that evening. Maybe at feast or by the bardic fire. What is the best way to start a conversation? Compliment their steed – "I saw you earlier on the field; you and your [equine] competed admirably!" Complimenting a rider's steed is a surefire way to start a conversation with ANY equestrian.



Another great place to start - Volunteer as ground crew

Equestrians ALWAYS need ground crew to help at events. Whether that is keeping time, writing down scores, resetting challenges, or making sure both mounts & riders are watered, Ground crew are ALWAYS appreciated and needed. This is the best way to become familiar with the games, as well as other equestrians. You don't have to ride to be ground crew, and we have several non-riders who regularly help us reset challenges, as well as keep track of our Lists and heralding (very similar to the Fighting List-Mistresses). At Gulf Wars, there is even a 'Best of the Ground Crew' challenge!

Dave a horse and want to get involved?

Read and Understand the Equestrian Handbook. If you need clarification, the KEO is always willing to answer any questions you may have. You will have to go through an authorization process at an equestrian event or official practice. This generally goes much smoother if you have been in contact with the Equestrian Marshal-in-Charge ahead of time, as well as other marshals. It is suggested that you help on the ground for an event (before bringing your horse) simply so that you know how the field runs and what is expected of a horse and rider.

Attend local official (and unofficial practices) to help you and your mount become more familiar with the games and equipment (as well as other equestrians).

Ride, but don't own a horse?

Get to know the equestrians who DO own horses. Communicate your level and experience of riding with the owner and express your interest in getting involved. BE HONEST. Offer to help with the care of the horse at an event, or even with the cost of attendance (it's expensive hauling a horse and trailer away from hom). Often, if the horse is gentle and well-trained, owners are more than willing to work with people in order to allow more inclusion into the equestrian activities. But don't assume that any and all owners will allow you use of their mount on your word that you know how to ride. Also, not all steeds are available for general riders. There are

often green or sensitive mounts, which simply are not ready to be ridden by anyone other than the owner. Don't let this deter you! Continue to offer your help, and be sure to talk to other owners, who just may have a horse that will fit your level.

It's a very delicate and personal decision allowing people that the owners may or may not know to ride their steed. Be aware and stay respectful of their position and their final decision.

Oon't really want to ride, but still interested in equestrian activities?

We still want YOU! Ground crew is, of course, one of the most useful ways to help out and be involved without actually riding or owning a horse. Other ways include setting up and breaking down (still part of the ground crew aspect) before and after an event or challenge. Heralds for the field are a precious commodity, as well.

Photography is also very appreciated. Often, equestrians are riding or working on the field, so rarely do we have time to take photos of our steeds in action. Often, one good photo of a rider cutting through a head of cabbage is worth months of praise from the rider. And can often be found proudly displayed online, if you've given permission.

Offers to help with research, new garb (or caparisons, which is garb for the mount), and new equipment will often be met with a resounding —Thank you! While some equestrians are skilled at these things, others are not and any offer of assistance is likely to be met with a hearty hug or handshake.

New Medieval Books

Sansovino's Venice: A Translation of Francesco Tatti da Sansovino's Guidebook to Venice of 1561 • by Vaughn Hart and Peter Hicks

This is the first English translation of Francesco Sansovino's (1521–1586) celebrated guide to Venice, which was first published in 1561. One of the earliest books to describe the monuments of Venice for inquisitive travelers, Sansovino's guide was written at a time when St. Mark's Piazza was in the process of taking the form we see today.

Excerpt: A Venetian and a Foreigner

V.[enetian]: Tell me please, kind sir, what do you think of this city?

F.[oreigner]:If I were to tell you the truth, you would not believe me/

V.: No, please tell me, for by saying it you will be praising God.

F.: She (as far as I can tell) can only be the work of the divinity, whether because of her site via which the city receives everything she needs, or because of her marvellous buildings and the great congregation of peoples here. Indeed, I have just read that when the Pope asked Mariano Sozzino the Elder, a great jurist in his time, what he thought of the city on seeing it, the latter replied: 'It seems to me a extraordinary thing because I have seen the impossible within the impossible'.

The Norse Myths: A Guide to the Gods and Heroes by Carolyne Larrington

Excerpt: Who were the Norse gods? Migrants from the Near East, journeying up through Germany to reach the promised Scandinavian homeland: humans like you and me, but smarter, handsomer, more civilized. Or so claimed one Christian writer, a medieval Icelander who recorded may of the myths and legends that have survived from the Scandinavian north. Medieval Christian scholars needed to explain why their ancestors worshipped false gods, and thus one widespread theory was that the pre-Christian gods were demons, wicked spirits sent by Satan to tempt humans into sin and error. But another very effective theory was the one put forward by Snorri Sturluson...

Streams of Gold, Rivers of Blood: The Rise and Fall of Byzantium, 955 A.D. to the First Crusade by Anthony Kaldellis


Excerpt: By following all the sources in detail and in tandem, I saw clearly for the first time patterns of imperial behavior that shaped both domestic and foreign policy. I also came to surprising conclusions, sometimes the opposite of what I expected to find. This was especially the case regarding the imperial collapse of the eleventh-century. For example, I was forced, against a Psellos-induced bias, to rehabilitate the military leadership of Konstantinos IX Monomachos. I also came to a completely different understanding of the behavior of the patriarch Michael Keroularios during the fateful summer of 1054. But more importantly, beyond the actions of specific individuals, I came to question a particular model of socioeconomic transformation that some sought to impose on this period.


