In a kind of game, verses or parts of them are repeated, and the keywords are usually the same, structuring the poem. The subway is fluctuating, but tends to be short. The tone is usually impersonal, but always fresh and sweet. The proliferation of gender and its few resources made it run out in less than a century; In spite of everything, some five hundred of unequal interest remain. "

### Cooks Guild: Reports for June and July 2019

Greetings from Jeanne Tenneur de Bec, Mistress of the Bright Hills Cooks' Guild.

On Sunday, June 9, the Guild met at Alecraft, a brew pub in Bel Air.

First on the agenda was the upcoming Trial by Fire Event, scheduled for June 14 – 16, 2019. Mistress Wynne is the autocrat. The site is the Baltimore Bowman, as usual. The site will open at 3:00 PM on Friday for campers. The Guild will hold a Travelers' Fare on Friday evening. Baron Gustav and Mistress Brienna will organize a spaghetti supper. There will also be a breakfast offered on Saturday morning, which will also be organized by Gustav and Brienna, with contributions from Mistress Cordelia and Mistress Wynne.

Both the Travelers' Fare and the Saturday breakfast will be fundraisers for the Cooks' Guild.

Mistress Brienna will manage the registration for the cooking competition. Mistress Jeanne will wrangle judges and organize prizes. The rules for the Trial by Fire cooking competition have been published.

The Royal Archery Competition will be held on September 14, 2019. The Guild is planning to provide lunch as a fundraiser. Mistress Wynne has offered to organize the lunch this year.

The Guild has been requested to provide the feast for this year's Harvest Wars event. The autocrat, Baroness Tatiana, has requested that we provide the same menu as the previous Harvest War. The Guild has agreed to provide the feast and Mistress Wynne has volunteered to serve as the Head Cook.

We discussed several ideas for upcoming meetings. Details will be provided as confirmed.

The Guild's next meeting will be held at the home of Mistress Wynne on Sunday, July 21.

On Sunday, July 21, the Guild met at the home of Mistress Wynne.

There are a lot of things happening over the next two months, and the Guild will be pretty busy.

First on the calendar is Pennsic. Lady Deirdre noted that Lady Faye de Trees will be set on vigil for the Order of the Laurel on Sunday of War Week. She asked that members of the Guild consider contributing to the vigil table. Duchess Simone is in charge.

During September, there are opportunities for the Guild to contribute to events each weekend. On 9/7, at the Battle on the Bay, Lady Alexandria will be put on vigil for the Order of the Pelican. Mistress Wynne has arranged for members of the Guild to provide several dishes that were specifically requested.

On 9/14, the Barony will host the Royal Archery Tournament, at the Baltimore Bowman. The Guild will provide lunch as a fundraiser. Mistress Wynne has agreed to help organize the lunch, which will consist of sandwiches and soups. The menu plan will be finalized at the August meeting.

The next weekend, on 9/21, Baroness Rebecca, as Vicaress, has requested that the Guild help provide a light lunch for the Baronial pavilion at Steirbach's Birthday event.

And the last weekend of the month, 9/28, brings the Baronial Harvest Wars event. The Guild, Under Mistress Wynne's able guidance, will provide the feast. The menu has been pretty much finalized. The main change will be to replace the beef roast with a venison



sausage. (Note: Mistress Brienna has casings available.)

The weekend of 10/5 will bring Coronation and the Investiture of our next Baron and Baroness. We have not yet been asked to provide anything, but that may come.

At the baronial meeting, Lady Ailis submitted a bid for Baronial Birthday, with Lady Rebekkah as her deputy. The bid was approved and the Guild has been asked to prepare the feast. The bid includes a per head fee of \$10 / person, with an expected headcount of 80 (since this is not a Royal Progress, we may drop the head count to 60.) After discussion, the Guild agreed to provide the feast. Once a Head Cook is identified, the menu will be discussed. Lady Rebekkah indicated that the theme will likely include unicorns.

We also discussed the upcoming Celebration of Life for Master Chirhart Blackstar, which will be held on 8/24. Mistress Cordelia is organizing the table, so if you plan to bring something please contact her. Other questions can be directed to Tim Dahl (tdgm298@yahoo.com) or to Mistress Jeanne.

The next meeting will be Sunday, August 18, at Lady Deirdre's.

### **Old Business:**

Our current contract with the Church expires at the end of September. At the moment there is not price increase for 2020. Options are:

Stepping Stone Museum would sponsor us either on or off-season. We can also rent it for the whole weekend for an event for only \$10 per head.

Carol County Community College is willing to rent us a meeting room for free once a month.

Eadyth says she checked other church prices and \$90 a week is a good price.

A suggestion of a mandatory \$5 a head was made as was only meeting 2-3 times a month to save money.

Daniella is working to find out more information to work with the recreation center which may be nothing to use if we are willing to have someone come to their council meeting. Also are we willing to change our fighter practice nights?

Suggestion to do a fund raiser to raise money for rental locations.

A motion was made, and seconded that we stay in our current location of the church until the end of January 2020. Passed unanimously.

Harvest Wars is finally spiked. Still need an overseer - youth marshal - Putting up pavillions for fighting field. We are ready to go live on the web.

Foyal archer - volunteers to set up - it is now spiked. Still need to get warrant signed.

Gold Key updates - At the next meeting a list of items will be brought.

### **New Business:**

Check from February of last year , the refund check from the Fire Hall is dead. Motion was made to write off the dead check out of our books. The vote was unanimous.

Pennsic is also the largest Society event, with attendance in recent years exceeding 10,000. The scheduled activities include large melee battles, tournaments, archery, stage performances, dancing, and hundreds of classes on medieval topics. The marketplace has over 200 merchants selling a variety of wares.

The opening weekend of Pennsic is the last Saturday in July, and the event runs for 2 weeks. If you decide to attend Pennsic for the full two weeks, there will certainly be plenty for you to do. But if you can only make it for a week or less, you'll want to be there during the second week, as that's when the battles and most other events are scheduled. Pennsic University classes & Artisans' Row start mid-week, and by the end of the week most other activities are underway, including performances, tournaments, archery, dancing, & children's activities.

Greetings to All Kingdom Seneschals in North America,

There has been much discussion lately concerning the use of waivers at demos held by local groups.

After reaching a consensus with the Corporate officers, effective immediately, waivers are required for demos that allow the public to participate in combat archery and/or thrown weapons.

At that point, with possibly other activities as well, viewers become participants and a waiver must be signed. Minors MUST have their parent or legal guardian sign such waivers.

The Seneschal's Handbook will be updated very soon to reflect this policy. [...]

The SCA Board of Directors has approved the language below to be used in the Society Seneschal's Handbook. While we believe this to be a functional policy we wish to consult subject matter experts in the area of youth activities and further changes may be made in the future. Motion by John St. Dennis that Section X.3 "Dealing With Minor/Youth -Related Policies of the Seneschal's Handbook be replaced with the following language effective immediately:

\*Parents or guardians of minors shall have ultimate responsibility for the welfare and behavior of their children at all times. It is the responsibility of the adult who brings a minor to an event to ensure that the minor is safe and not in danger. At events in which youth participate in any way, participating minors must either have a parent or legal guardian present at the event, or an accompanying adult present in possession of a properly executed "Medical Authorization Form for Minors." \*

Notification of this change to the membership should be accompanied by the following announcement: "\*The SCA Board of Directors has approved the language below to be used in the Society Seneschals Handbook. While we believe this to be a functional policy we wish to consult subject matter experts in the area of youth activities and further changes may be made in the future. We greatly appreciate thoughtful suggestions to policy language and welcome commentary."\*

Second by Dan Watson. In favor: Natalie Degerstrom T.S. Morgan, Vandy Pacetti-Donelson, Richard Sherman, John St. Dennis, Dan Watson. Opposed: None. Chairman Craig Carter exercised his option to vote and did so in favor of the motion. Motion carried 7-0.

## A Passable Pseudo-German Soft Pretzel can be made at home

### Ingredients:

- 1/8 cup hot but not boiling water
- 1 package active dry yeast
- 1 1/3 cup warm water
- 1/3 cup brown sugar
- 5 plus cups flour, Kosher salt.

*As you can see, the recipe contains no butter or eggs which were not to be used during Lent. The resemblance to arms crossed in prayer makes it a fine treat for Lent.*



Benedictine monks - 12th century

Preheat oven to 475 degrees (you will reduce it when the pretzels are popped in)

Mix the hot water and yeast in a large bowl until the yeast dissolves. Stir in the warm water and the brown sugar. Slowly add 5 cups of flour to the mixture, stirring constantly.

Continue stirring until well-blended, then turn the dough onto a floured board and knead a few minutes until it is smooth. Prepare two cookie sheets by oiling them and sprinkling them liberally with coarse kosher salt.

Pinch off a piece of pretzel dough about the size of a golf ball. Roll the dough into a rope 14 inches long and as thick as your thumb. Bend the rope into a u shape, cross one end of the rope over the other end about 3 inches from the tips. Twist the cross ends making a full turn. Fold the ends back, toward the middle of the U. Open the ends slightly to form a pretzel shape, press the ends into the dough firmly.

Meanwhile, fill a deep frying pan with water and add 1 tablespoon of baking soda for each cup of water in the pan. Bring water to a slow, gentle boil. Use a spatula to carefully lower each pretzel into the pan and count slowly to 30. Then lift the pretzel onto the greased and salted cookie sheet. Repeat until all the dough is used. Sprinkle some kosher salt on top of the pretzels and put them in the oven and immediately reduced the heat to 200 degrees.

Bake for 8 minutes or until they are golden brown. Makes 30 average size pretzels.

It is believed that the pretzel or 'pretiola' (little rewards) had its beginnings around 610 AD, though there are few sources to back up this claim. Documentation does show that German bakers used a pretzel shaped pastries as badge emblems in 1111 AD. The Hortum Deliciarum from southwest German Alsace depicts what may be a picture of a pretzel.

It has been used to describe the trinity The three empty holes and given as rewards to children who learned their Bible verses.

Travel west along Security Boulevard about one-half mile, through traffic-lights at Belmont Avenue, Lord Baltimore Drive, and Rolling Road. Continue west for another block, until you reach Brookdale Road. The Episcopal Church of Christ the King is on your left. Make a left turn onto Brookdale, and then turn right into the Church parking lot.
