



# **Roman Honeyfingers**

This recipe is a curiosity. The honeyfingers fry to a crispy crunch on the outside while remaining a bit chewy on the inside. The pieces are easy to cut into shapes, and could probably even be rolled into logs. The flavor is really all about the honey, but the pepper and cinnamon on top, as well as the pine nuts, add a slight complexity.

piper, nucleos, mel, rutam et passum teres, cum lacte et tracta coques. coagulum coque cum modicis ovis...ita ut durissimam pultem facias, deinde in patellam expandis. cum refrixerit, concidis quasi dulcia et frigis in oleo optimo. levas, perfundis mel, piper aspargis et inferes. melius feceris, si lac pro aqua miseris. — Apicus, 4th Century

#### INGREDIENTS

2/3 cup plus 3/4 cup flour
1 cup whole milk (goat or cow)
Olive oil
2 tablespoons cooking sherry or sweet wine
1 egg, beaten
1/3 cup pine nuts, finely chopped
Cinnamon to taste
Ground black pepper to taste
1 cup honey, or more if needed
Chopped pine nuts for garnish



In a medium saucepan, whisk the 2/3 cup flour a little at a time into the cold milk so that there are no lumps. Add 1 tablespoon of the oil and the sherry, and cook on medium-high heat, stirring constantly, until a thick porridge forms. Remove the pan from the heat and continue to stir briskly to cool the mixture.

When the porridge is lukewarm, add the egg and stir briskly until it is blended. Stir in the pine nuts and a dash of cinnamon and pepper. Stir in the remaining 3/4 cup flour to make a dough that is sticky but can still be handled.

On a floured board with floured hands, press the dough out to a 1/2-inch-thick rectangle; cut it into finger-size strips.

Cover the bottom of a frying pan with a layer of olive oil about 1/2 inch deep. Heat the oil and fry the strips of dough until they are golden brown and crispy. Remove the fried strips to a plate covered with paper towels to drain. Dip them in honey and sprinkle them with cinnamon and pine nuts.



## Humpty Dumpty - Truth of Myth?

Humpty Dumpty sat on a wall, Humpty Dumpty had a great fall, All the king's horses and all the king's men, Couldn't put Humpty Dumpty together again.

e have all heard the sad tale of Humpty Dumpty, but have you ever wondered what the story was behind this rhyme. Nursery rhymes are commonly linked to historical or political events, but it is often difficult to pinpoint them exactly because they are cryptic. The rumor is that the reason for

being cryptic is so you could say them and laugh about thier political or scandalous nature without threat of death or punishment, because, after all they were just children's rhymes...right? Generally, we think of nursery rhymes as simple rhymes or clapping games to teach young children rather then look at their historical significance.


What then is the solution to Humpty's dilemma? Why couldn't the horses or men put him back together again. What does it actually mean? There are a couple of theories about the origin of this rhyme.

First where did the name Humpty Dumpty come from? Apparently, it was a common nickname used in the 15th Century England to describe large people. (Humpty Dumpty and the Fall of Colchester, 2006) But why do

we think that Humpty was an egg? The portrayal that most people think of when you hear the name Humpty Dumpty is an egg and that we can blame on Lewis Carroll's description of Humpty Dumpty, others say it has to do the shape of the lump on King Richard III back.

The first theory is that Humpty Dumpty alludes to King Richard III, whose brutal 26-month reign ended with his death in the Battle of Bosworth in 1485. Supposedly, King Richard III's horse was either named "Wall," or his men, who abandoned him, were representative of the "wall." In either case the king fell off his horse during battle and was bludgeoned so severely his men could not save him, becoming the last king to die in battle. (The Origin of Humpty Dumpty, 2013)

Historians have long thought that King Richard III was humpbacked. Shakespeare overexaggerated this myth, when he portrayed him as "a poisonous bump-backed toad" in his historical play, which was first performed in the early 1600s. It wasn't until the 2012 discovery of Richard III's skeleton beneath a parking lot in Leicester which led to an updated diagnosis of severe scoliosis, which meant one shoulder might have been a little higher. The skeletal remains also showed evidence of 11 wounds, eight of which were to the skull. (Hamilton, 2018)





The second theory is that Humpty Dumpty was a cannon in Colchester, England, during the town's siege in 1648. The town had a majestic castle and several churches encircled by a protective wall. A large and heavy cannon, nicknamed Humpty Dumpty, was strategically placed atop St Mary's as the Wall Church to defend the city, and manned by "One-Eyed" Jack Thompson. The top of the church tower was hit by the enemy, causing the cannon to tumble to the ground, where it shattered and could not be put back together again.

Other more obscure theories are that "Humpty Dumpty" referred to Charles I himself - the Humpty Dumpty of England. He was toppled by the Puritan majority in Parliament (the great fall). The King's army (Cavaliers) could not give his power back and



Charles I was executed. Another idea says the rhyme refers to King Richard III and his defeat at the Battle of Bosworth. Yet another says that Humpy Dumpty was based on the sudden catastrophic fall of Cardinal Wolsey from Henry VIII era. The Cardinal became ill on the way to his trial and died before he got to London. He was Henry's most trusted friend for a long time, until Anne Boleyn came along and turned Henry against him. No one expected him to be toppled so quickly. (Humpty Dumpty and the Fall of Colchester, 2006)



Humpty Dumpty's most famous literary appearance comes from Through the Looking-Glass by Lewis Carroll (1872), where he appears as a fussily exacting egg-head who corrects Alice's grammar and discusses the value and meaning of words.

"When I use a word," Humpty Dumpty said [to Alice], in rather a scornful tone, "it means just what I choose it to mean—neither more nor less."

The same could be applied to the Humpty Dumpty origin story—it can mean just what you choose it to mean, neither more nor less. It is after all just a nursery rhyme or is it?


